

Twenty Eighth Annual Report of the BCU Board 2007

This report is presented for the information of all members of the incorporated British Canoe Union and refers to proceedings and activities from 1 November 2006 until 31 October 2007.

BCU Annual Review 2006/2007

This has been another successful year for both competition and business. In addition to our increased medal tally and record membership figures, the profile of our sport continues to improve in the media.

Our staffing re-structure has been successfully completed and enables us to manage the organisation more efficiently, allowing us to respond quickly to the fast changing environment in which we operate. The new structure has 5 core functional areas:

- World Class Olympic Performance & Development
- UK Coaching
- English Development
- Operations & Customer Services
- Competition

We have consolidated into the main BCU office in Bingham, our UK Coaching, English Development, Operations and Customer Services sections. Additionally, we have established our World Class Podium and Development Programmes under the leadership of our Performance Director, John Anderson, at Holme Pierrepont and Bisham Abbey. To compliment this, we have also successfully established Academies at Nottingham and Bisham supporting our Olympic Development Programmes.

2008 is an Olympic year. As part of their preparations, our Olympic disciplines have made a few trips to the Olympic sites and have also competed at various competitions there. The coming year will be very important and exciting for the BCU and its World Class Athletes, and therefore our Olympic Podium Programme continues to direct their prime focus on performances through to Beijing.

2007 was an exceptionally successful year for our competition disciplines. Special mention must go to three outstanding athletes: Tim Brabants, Anna Hemmings and Sandra Hyslop. All three athletes took gold in their World Championship events: Tim in the K1 1000m Sprint, Anna in the Marathon and Sandra in WWR. It should also be noted and celebrated that Anna's total number of World Titles now sits at six: quite an achievement!

A great deal of work has already gone into the new 2012 Olympic White Water Course. This will undoubtedly become an iconic venue for the 2012 Olympic Games but it will be far more than an Olympic Slalom course. The detailed design will reveal a facility that gives a fantastic legacy for the whole sport. Additionally, improvements to existing courses at Teesside and Nottingham will leave us with a fine stock of whitewater facilities.

The coming year is all about 'Participation' and 'Performance.' Both terms are compatible with our members and our funders. To be clear, our World Class Programmes, funded through UK Sport, are about performing at the highest level. They are about developing our leading athletes to compete at World Championships and ultimately the Olympic Games. We will continue to fund our competitive teams in the non-Olympic disciplines, again focusing on our most talented athletes.

Coaching

2007 has been a frustrating but productive year for BCU coaching.

As we noted in the 2006 report the year was going to be a challenge as we moved to implement the new Star Awards and new Coaching Awards.

Frustrations came in the form of delays to the implementation of the new Coaching Awards (BCU Certificate in Coaching Paddlesports Awards) due to having to meet the three parallel endorsement requirements of BCU, UKCC and the National Qualifications Framework.

The new BCU Level 1 and 2 Certificate in Coaching Paddlesports Awards are now live and a number of new Level 1 courses have been successfully completed with positive feedback from both candidates and tutors.

The new Level 3 Certificate in Coaching Paddlesports is currently in the endorsement phase. We now aim for this to go live in September 2008. In the meantime the 'old style' level 3 will be available to candidates until the end of July 2008. Course authorisation and Candidate registration will be available through until the end of June 2008.

The new learning programmes are about future coaches and future paddlers. Developments in the coach update programmes are about continuing to support existing coaches.

Hopefully we can all begin to focus on this major development in the sense of it being about future coaches and future paddlers. That said, those of us who have come up through the 'old style' scheme should not see this as suggesting that they are some how different, or that the job we currently do is not valued or up to the mark!

Successes are:

- Level 1 and 2 BCU Certificate in Coaching Paddlesports Awards are now ready to implement. Level 3 is to be submitted for endorsement in December.
- Performance Award Scheme – the new Paddlepower and Star Awards. The new awards provide a balanced progression for paddlers. They support them as they move through the sport and, most importantly, encourage them to go paddling. The awards have been developed around the needs of today's paddlers, with direction from the findings of the Paddlesport Review and the BCU Long Term Paddler Development Review. This new scheme is based on over 5 years worth of research and reflects current best practice as defined by Paddlesport's leading experts.

Paddlepower is a youth centred scheme aimed at encouraging young people to come into and stay in paddlesport - Paddlepower Start, Passport, Discover, Explore and Excel.

The new Star Awards provide the support and encouragement paddlers need to get out and go paddling. The initial awards are generic, encouraging paddlers to experience the various disciplines within paddlesport, with paddlers 'specialising' at the Three Star Award. The emphasis of these initial awards is to develop personal skills and gain independence. The Four and Five Star Awards are leadership awards and enable paddlers to lead groups in appropriate conditions.

- Awarding Body Status - Our submission to the Quality Curriculum Authority (QCA) to become a nationally recognised and government endorsed awarding body was successful. National recognition and the positioning of BCU awards on the national qualification framework will clearly be a benefit to the BCU in the future.

English Development

The Paddlesport Participation Programme continues to work locally to support clubs and organisations to give young people the best possible start and provide suitable pathways for progression to develop and succeed at their chosen level. Nationally, we have continued our work to develop new initiatives to support our aims whilst endeavouring to embed older initiatives into existing structures. We now have 50 accredited Top Clubs and 62 clubs working towards accreditation.

We have continued to manage, support and develop the Lightning Sprint series, which has been expanded to include Rocket K4 (a new Junior K4). Over 25 clubs and over 350 entries supported the 2007 series. This year the Junior Development Project, through the Community Club Development programme, has contributed £50,000 to Canoe England Top Clubs and Sport England Club Mark clubs for match funded equipment.

New initiatives and resources have been implemented and produced which include "Cross Stream Challenge", a revised Paddlepower scheme to support Step into Sport and School Club Links. In January, Canoe England was successfully audited and licensed for two years to deliver the Clubmark awards for Sport England along with our own Top Club accreditation scheme.

The PESSCL scheme continues to grow and last year the Canoe England PESSCL award scheme was launched which supported accredited clubs to apply for grants of £1000 or £500 to support school club links. As part of this programme we support 15 BCU Community Sports Coaches and now have 1,237 schools across England involved in Paddlesport. We have also continued to forge greater links with the County

Sport Partnerships across England to ensure that Paddlesport is included in the strategic discussion making process at both County and Regional level.

Equity and Volunteers

We have introduced the Canoe England Volunteer Awards, a regular volunteer newsletter and a National and Young Volunteers support group. The BCU Equity Policy has been reviewed and a three year action plan is being finalised. Progress is being made on the Preliminary Equity Standard with submission due in March 2008.

Child Protection

We have passed the Intermediate Standard of Child Protection and have started working towards the Advanced Level.

Access

In June a new Head of Access was appointed to lead our policy and planning.

The first anniversary of the Environment Agency report "Putting pilot voluntary canoe access agreements in place" was in October. The BCU continues to express their grave concerns about the summary report and the implications for canoeing. Canoe England continues to press the case for new legislation akin to the Scottish Land Reform Act. The Environment Agency are now reviewing their work and are due to publish a final report

Coastal Access

In January, work commenced with a like minded group of organisations to review the way forward for Coastal Access which resulted in a positioning statement being sent to Natural England. The coalition (The Ramblers' Association, British Canoe Union, British Mountaineering Council, British Caving Association, CTC, Central Council of Physical Recreation, Equestrian Access Forum, International Mountain Biking Association UK and the Open Spaces Society) of Britain's leading outdoor organisations called for Natural England to recommend ministers to introduce a permanent, multi-user, right of access corridor around England's beautiful coastline. A press day was held at Brean Down, Somerset by the coalition on Thursday 9th August demonstrating the need for a Coastal Access Corridor. Coast lovers (including the Rivers Access Campaign) united to promote a permanent right of access to the coastline and to express support for a coastal access corridor in England.

In September, the Rt Hon Hilary Benn MP announced that access to the coast would be obtained by Primary Legislation giving the campaign more ammunition to demand legislation for access to inland waters.

Rivers Access Campaign

The Public Access to Inland Waters Bill (2007) was presented to Parliament by Dr Des Turner MP as a 10 Minute Rule Bill on January 24th. The Bill was written following advice from the Scottish Ramblers and lawyers who have had experience of the Scottish Land Reform Act. The Bill did not get a second reading as Parliamentary time was limited but it is hoped that the updated version will be put forward during the coming Parliamentary session.

Support from MPs and other organisations has significantly grown and now the Campaign gets contact from organisations such as the Outdoor Swimming Society whose needs are the same as ours and stating that they wish to support our work.

Dr Des Turner MP arranged a meeting with Martin Salter MP to talk about the Bill and negotiate support to get it to Committee stage for further debate. Martin initially asked us not to continue with the Bill but subsequently agreed to look at an access code to bring interested parties together. We are still waiting! In the meantime the Campaign has started to compile an Access Code to support the Bill.

Raising the profile of the Campaign – The Campaign, ably supported by really enthusiastic volunteers, went to the three main party conferences to lobby MPs and visitors. At the Labour Party Conference our issue even made it on to the Radio 4 PM Programme.

The Campaign has had a significant increase in media interest this year. Breakfast BBC took the access story as a result of the Campaign being misrepresented in the Sunday Telegraph and the BCU Press release refuting the negative comments. The filming took place in Exeter at Haven Banks. The Campaign had many positive responses from all around the country as a result of the TV coverage. ITV also took the story and on

a wet Friday afternoon a group from Poole Harbour Canoe Club came down to the banks of the river Frome in Wareham to take part in a film for Meridian TV about access to rivers.

BBC South also ran a programme on the Inside Out series concerning the River Avon in Hampshire. It stated that a 1664 law could prove the right to canoe or navigate on the river. The Reverend Douglas Caffyn stated "Some things in life are fairly certain and the fact that there is a right of navigation on the Avon is one of them". The Law Society has confirmed that the act has never been repealed.

Facilities

The BCU, through the Community Club Development Programme (CCDP), is currently supporting 11 clubs/projects to improve their facilities. Over £1 million of grants have been allocated to these clubs from the scheme which is funded by DCMS through Sport England.

We will continue to develop places to go canoeing through developing greater access rights, steering investment into key clubs and encouraging the construction of major facilities.

Membership

The Customer Services Team is now well established and is looking after 27,000 individual members, 420 affiliated clubs and their 25,000 members.

The Team is taking 67,000 phone calls per year with an answer rate of 88.64%. In addition, 87,000 items of post are despatched each year.

We have increased the number of outlets providing discounts to members and will be adding significant benefits in the coming year giving members even better value for money.

The Canoeing Foundation has now been fully incorporated, resulting in a charity with the widest terms of reference available in order to generate more funds for canoeing in general.

Governance

In governance, for the second year running, we achieved the highest score of any NGB in the UK Sport/ Sport England self assurance programme.

Finance

Due to prudent management by the Board and Senior Management Team of the BCU's finances, we consider that we are well placed to meet the challenges which we will face in the future; both in the elite sport arena (e.g. London 2012) and the recreational arena (e.g. the increased Government emphasis to involve the population in participatory sport for both health and social reasons.)

We consider that our finances are in a robust condition to enable us to remain attractive to potential funders, both from the public and private sectors and thus continue to develop both the provision and quality of the services and facilities which we can offer to participants.

BCU Structure

The BCU is managed through its Board of Directors who are representative of canoeing across the UK. The Board of Directors are ultimately responsible to the membership.

The Directors delegate certain functions to Management Committees:

The UK Coaching Management Committee deals with all matters associated with the co-ordination of coaching across the UK.

The World Class Management Group manages and administers all aspects of the World Class Programme.

The English Council oversees the operation of the BCU's activities within its English Division (Canoe England).
